THE EDUCATION (SALARIES AND STAFFING) REGULATIONS 1957, AMENDMENT NO. 4

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
 - 2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended—
 - (a) By revoking the definition of the term "Organising teacher":
 - (b) By inserting, in the appropriate alphabetical order, the following definition:
 - "'Adviser to rural schools' means a teacher appointed under the provisions of the Act to give professional assistance to teachers in schools in rural areas."
- 3. Regulation 36 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 8 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 1, is hereby further amended by revoking subclause (1), and substituting the following subclause:
- "(1) Where, in the opinion of the Director, there are special educational needs in a school or department which warrant additional staffing, the Board may, on the recommendation of the Senior Inspector and with the approval of the Director, appoint to that school or department one or more certificated teachers as fulltime or part-time assistants in excess of the staff otherwise prescribed by these regulations:

*S.R. 1957/119 Amendment No. 1: S.R. 1960/112 Amendment No. 2: S.R. 1961/54 Amendment No. 3: S.R. 1964/14 Provided that no part-time assistant so appointed to a school or department shall be employed in that school or department for more than fifteen hours in any week."

- 4. The principal regulations are hereby further amended by inserting, after regulation 38, the following regulation:
- "38A. Where in the opinion of the Director there are special educational needs in a Maori school, the Director may, on the recommendation of the Senior Inspector of Maori Schools, appoint to that school one or more certificated teachers as fulltime or part-time assistants in excess of the staff otherwise prescribed by these regulations:

Provided that no part-time assistant so appointed to a Maori school shall be employed in that school for more than fifteen hours in any

week."

- 5. The principal regulations are hereby amended by omitting the words "organising teachers" where they appear in regulation 46 and in the heading thereto, and substituting in each case the words "advisers to rural schools."
- 6. Regulation 56 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 2 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 2, is hereby further amended by adding the following proviso:

"Provided that, where the Minister approves the appointment of a Deputy Principal in any post-primary school, that position shall, for the purpose of determining the number of positions of responsibility in accordance with any such scheme, be deemed to be a position of responsibility of Class D."

- 7. (1) The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking the First and Second Schedules, as substituted by regulation 4 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 3, and substituting the First and Second Schedules set out in the First Schedule of these regulations.
- (2) Regulation 4 of, and the First Schedule to, the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 3, are hereby consequentially revoked.
- (3) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April 1963.
- 8. (1) The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking the Eleventh Schedule, as substituted by regulation 5 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 3, and substituting the Eleventh Schedule set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations.
- (2) Regulation 5 of, and the Second Schedule to, the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 3, are hereby consequentially revoked.
- 9. The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking the Twelfth Schedule, as substituted by regulation 13 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 1, and substituting the Twelfth Schedule set out in the Third Schedule to these regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide for the appointment of Deputy Principals of post-primary schools, for the employment of part-time teachers in primary, intermediate, and Maori schools, and for teachers now known as organising teachers to be designated as advisers to rural schools. They also set out revised salary scales.
