ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Court at Government House, Wellington, this 12th day of March 1970

Present:

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Education Act 1964 and the Royal Powers Act 1953, Her Majesty the Queen, acting by and with the advice and consent of Her Executive Council, is pleased to make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Education Boards' Employment Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 13, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education Boards' Employment Regulations 1958* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- **2. Interpretation**—Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, in their appropriate alphabetical order, the following definitions:
 - "'Lower Sixth Form Certificate' means the Lower Sixth Form Certificate awarded under the Education (Secondary Instruction) Regulations 1968; and includes the Endorsed School Certificate formerly awarded under those regulations:"
 - "'School Certificate' means such standard of success in the School Certificate Examination as the Review Committee may from time to time by notice in the Education Gazette determine:".
- **3. Additional salary payable to certain whole-time officers**—Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:
- "(3) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this regulation, where (as a result of the general review and determination by the Review Committee of the grades of salary applicable to whole-time officers and positions as from the 1st day of February 1967) any whole-time officer of a Board remaining in the same position has suffered a reduction in his yearly rate of salary, the Board may, with the approval

of the Review Committee, pay to the officer such additional salary while he remains in the position as is necessary to enable the officer's yearly rate of salary to equal that which he was receiving immediately before the determination."

- **4. Reconsideration of an appointment**—Regulation 11 of the principal regulations, as substituted by subclause (1) of regulation 5 of the Education Boards' Employment Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 11, is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (a) of subclause (2), and substituting the following paragraph:
 - "(a) As soon as possible after making the appointment, the Board shall give notice of the appointment to every officer on the whole-time staff of a Board who was an unsuccessful applicant for the position, and any such officer may apply for the appointment to be reconsidered. Such notice shall, in the case of any unsuccessful applicant for the position who is an officer of the Board making the appointment, be given in writing requiring a signed and dated acknowledgment of receipt thereof, but shall in every other case be given by registered letter requiring an acknowledgment receipt:".

Amendments to First Schedule of Principal Regulations

- 5. Parts I and II between 1 August 1967 and 31 March 1968—(1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations, as heretofore amended, is hereby further amended by revoking Parts I and II, and substituting the Parts set out in the First Schedule to these regulations.
- (2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of August 1967.
- (3) This regulation and the First Schedule to these regulations shall be deemed to have continued in force until the 31st day of March 1968 and to have then expired.
- 6. Parts I and II between 1 April 1968 and 11 August 1968—
 (1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking Parts I and II, as substituted by regulation 5 of these regulations, and substituting the Parts set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations.
- (2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April 1968.
- (3) This regulation and the Second Schedule to these regulations shall be deemed to have continued in force until the 11th day of August 1968 and to have then expired.
- 7. Parts I and II on and after 12 August 1968—(1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking Parts I and II, as substituted by regulation 6 of these regulations, and substituting the Parts set out in the Third Schedule to these regulations.
- (2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 12th day of August 1968.

8. Part III between 1 August 1967 and 11 August 1968—(1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations, as heretofore amended, is hereby further amended by revoking Part III, and substituting the Part set out in the Fourth Schedule to these regulations.

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the

1st day of August 1967.

- (3) This regulation and the Fourth Schedule to these regulations shall be deemed to have continued in force until the 11th day of August 1968 and to have then expired.
- **9. Part III on and after 12 August 1968**—(1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking Part III, as substituted by regulation 8 of these regulations, and substituting the Part set out in the Fifth Schedule to these regulations.

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 12th day of August 1968.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide for increases in the salary rates applicable to officers and positions on the staff of Education Boards. They also vary the requirements in respect of the notices to be given to unsuccessful applicants for appointment to a position with an Education Board of Grade B or a higher grade.
