THE EDUCATION BOARD GRANTS REGULATIONS 1952, AMENDMENT NO. 6

COBHAM, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 17th day of December 1958

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Education Board Grants Regulations 1952, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education Board Grants Regulations 1952* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 2 of the Education Board Grants Regulations 1952, Amendment No. 2, and by regulation 4 of the Education Board Grants Regulations 1952, Amendment No. 5, is further amended by revoking paragraph (f), and substituting the following paragraph:

"(f) A grant at the rate of 1s. 5d. for each square foot of the total floor space in class rooms of public schools and manual training centres, and lecture rooms and laboratories at training colleges, and for each square foot of floor area in assembly halls, dental clinics, teachers' and caretakers' residences (including detached garages and washhouses forming part thereof), garages for school buses of the Department of Education, and the Board's offices and workshops, which grant, after deducting a sum equal to a thirty-fourth of its total amount for the payment of expenses incurred in the replacement of obsolete furniture in public schools, shall be expended proportionately as follows:

(i) Four-fifths shall be applied in or towards the payment of all expenses incurred in the maintenance and repair of schools and of teacher's residences (including the repair and renewal of out-buildings, furniture, equipment, and fences) and in the maintenance of the Board's offices and workshops, school grounds, swimming baths, garages for school buses of the Department of Education, and other improvements erected or constructed on school sites; and

(ii) Out of the remaining fifth shall be paid the balance of the expenses specified in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, and all minor capital expenditure where the cost at any one time does not exceed £200 at any school and the expenditure improves or in any way adds to the capital value of an existing asset or creates a new asset, including expenditure incurred for the provision of land, buildings, alterations to buildings, school fittings, school furniture, teaching equipment, ground improvements; also subsidies on money raised by public subscriptions for swimming baths and other works approved by the Director; and out of which fifth may be paid other capital expenditure incurred by the Board on school buildings, furniture, and equipment for schools:".

3. The Education Board Grants Regulations 1952, Amendment No. 2, and regulation 4 of the Education Board Grants Regulations 1952, Amendment No. 5, are hereby consequentially revoked.

4. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these regulations or in the regulations revoked by these regulations, the annual grants payable under all such regulations to every Education Board for the year ending with the 31st day of January 1959 shall be as follows:

- (a) Grants equal to one-sixth of the annual grants payable under the regulations revoked by these regulations, which shall be applied in accordance with those regulations as if they had not been revoked:
- (b) Grants equal to five-sixths of the annual grants payable under these regulations, which shall be applied in accordance with these regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide for an increase of the grant payable to Education Boards for the maintenance of buildings, and vary the purposes for which the grant may be expended.
