



**THE EDUCATIONAL BURSARIES REGULATIONS 1940,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

THE HON. D. G. SULLIVAN PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act, 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Educational Bursaries Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Educational Bursaries Regulations 1940* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1944.

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended as follows:—

(a) By adding to clause 5 the following paragraph:—

“(f) Bursaries in Science”:

(b) By inserting after clause 29 the following new clause:—

“Bursaries in Science

“ 30. (1) Every applicant for a Bursary in Science shall, with his application, furnish evidence that he has passed the Entrance Examination of the University of New Zealand or some equivalent examination approved for the purpose by the Director, or has received a Higher Leaving Certificate under the Education Act, 1914.

“(2) Where a selection is required to be made from applicants for Bursaries in Science, preference shall be given to candidates who have shown special proficiency in mathematics and science.

“(3) A Bursary in Science shall be tenable at a University College, and the holder of the bursary shall enter on the course for the degree of Bachelor of Science.”

(c) By adding to the Second Schedule the following:—

(i) In the first column the words: “ Bursary in Science ”:

(ii) In the second, third, fourth, and fifth columns (opposite the reference to a Bursary in Science) a reference to £20, £10, £40, and £10 respectively:

(iii) In the sixth column (opposite the reference to a Bursary in Science) the words “ Four years ”.

3. Clause 6 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following as subclause (2) thereof:—

“(2) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this clause, the Director, with the approval or by direction of the Minister, may, in respect of any candidate for a bursary under these regulations, dispense with the requirements of paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) of this clause.”
