**THE EDUCATION (ASSESSMENT, CLASSIFICATION, AND APPOINTMENT) REGULATIONS 1965, AMENDMENT NO. 5**

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title**—These regulations may be cited as the Education (Assessment, Classification, and Appointment) Regulations 1965, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education (Assessment, Classification, and Appointment) Regulations 1965\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

**2. Right of certain manual training teachers to appointment**—Regulation 65 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the words “a full-time permanent assistant”, the words “or to a position at a manual training centre as a full-time manual training teacher”, and also by inserting, after the words “as a secondary teacher”, the words “or as a manual training teacher”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations amend the Education (Assessment, Classification, and Appointment) Regulations 1965. Manual training teachers who have lost or are about to lose their positions at any school by reason of a fall in the attendance at the school, or by reason of the reorganisation of the school, will be entitled to be appointed to positions at manual training centres as full-time manual training teachers in preference to other applicants for those positions.
