THE RIGHT HON. R. D. MULDOON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Education (Assessment, Classification, and Appointment) Regulations 1976, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education (Assessment, Classification, and Appointment) Regulations 1976* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Other service may be recognised—Regulation 75 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding, as subclause (2), the following subclause:

“(2) The Director-General may, either generally or in any particular case, after consultation with the New Zealand Post Primary Teachers Association Registered and the New Zealand Secondary School Boards Association (Incorporated), authorise service that is—

“(a) In his opinion professional experience appropriate for persons holding the position of guidance counsellor; but

“(b) Not specified in subclause (1) or subclause (2) of regulation 73 of these regulations—
to be treated, for the purposes only of the appointment of persons, or a particular person, as guidance counsellor, as if it were service so specified.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

This amendment allows the Director-General to treat non-teaching experience that in his opinion is relevant to the giving of guidance and counselling to students as if it were teaching experience, in relation to the appointment of guidance counsellors at secondary schools.
