PURSUANT to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Education (School Committees Incidental Expenses) Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education (School Committees Incidental Expenses) Regulations 1949* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subparagraph (xi) of paragraph (b), and substituting the

following subparagraph:

"(xi) The rental of one telephone installed in school premises in schools of Grade V and above and in district high schools of Grade IV; also half the cost of the rental of one telephone installed either in the school or in the teacher's residence provided by the Board in the case of schools of lower grade than those specified in this subparagraph; but in no case the rental of a telephone installed in the living quarters of a teacher which are not a teacher's residence provided by the Board, or the rental of the extension to any telephone; ".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations extend the class of cases where the whole or part of the rental of a telephone installed in a school or teacher's residence provided by the Board may be paid from the grant made to the School Committee for incidental expenses.
