1. This order may be cited as the Evidence (Photographic Copies) Order 1961.

2. The Manukau County Council is hereby declared to be an authorised person for the purposes of the Evidence Act 1908.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order declares the Manukau County Council to be an authorised person for the purposes of the Evidence Act 1908. The effect of the order is that section 5 of the Evidence Amendment Act 1952 will apply to the Council, so that photographic copies of its records will be admissible in evidence.
