PURSUANT to the Evidence Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

### ORDER

1. **Title**—This order may be cited as the Evidence (Photographic Copies) Order 1969.

2. **Authorised persons**—The savings bank and company specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be authorised persons for the purposes of the Evidence Act 1908.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

The effect of this order declaring the Southland Savings Bank and B.P. (New Zealand) Limited to be authorised persons for the purposes of the Evidence Act 1908 is that section 5 of the Evidence Amendment Act 1952 will apply to them, so that photographic copies of their records will be admissible in evidence.
