2. **Authorised person**—Haywrights Limited is hereby declared to be an authorised person for the purposes of the Evidence Act 1908.

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order declares Haywrights Limited to be an authorised person for the purposes of the Evidence Act 1908. The effect of the order is that section 5 of the Evidence Amendment Act 1952 will apply to the company so that photographic copies of its records will be admissible in evidence.
