AMENDMENT NO. 6**

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Reserve Bank of New Zealand Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Exchange Control Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Exchange Control Regulations 1978* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1984.

2. Third Schedule amended—The Third Schedule to the principal regulations (as added by regulation 7 of the Exchange Control Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 2, and amended by regulation 2 of the Exchange Control Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 3, and regulation 2 of the Exchange Control Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 4, and regulation 2

of the Exchange Control Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 5) is hereby further amended by omitting the name "TKM (New Zealand) Limited", and substituting the name "Wardley New Zealand Limited".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 1984, amend the list of authorised foreign exchange dealers set out in the Third Schedule to the Exchange Control Regulations 1978. The amendments result from TKM (New Zealand) Limited changing its name to Wardley New Zealand Limited.
