## THE EXCISE DUTY (SPIRITS) ORDER 1960

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Greymouth this 29th day of March 1960

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 66 of the Distillation Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

### ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Excise Duty (Spirits) Order 1960.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The rate of excise duty on spirits made or distilled in New Zealand of the classes or kinds specified in the Schedule hereto shall be 90s. the proof gallon.

### SCHEDULE

#### CLASSES OR KINDS OF SPIRITS

SPIRITS and spirituous mixtures, the strength of which can be ascertained by Sykes's hydrometer or other similar instrument, viz: Gin, geneva, schnapps, vodka, and other basically derived white spirit liquors as may be approved by the Minister.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order fixes the rate of duty in respect of gin and related liquors manufactured in New Zealand at 90s. the proof gallon.
