THE ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT ORDER 1942

PURSUANT to the Electricity Emergency Regulations 1939* and the Supply Control Emergency Regulations 1939†, the Electricity Controller doth hereby order and direct as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Electrical Equipment Order 1942.

2. Except with the prior consent in writing of the Electricity Controller, no person shall sell or otherwise dispose of any electrical generating-plant (whether alternating or direct current), or any distribution transformer, hard-drawn copper conductor, or underground electric-supply cable, or any accessories pertaining to any such plant, transformer, conductor, or cable.

3. Every application for the requisite consent shall include details of the plant and equipment to be sold or disposed of, the name of the owner and of the other party, and the purpose for which and the place where it is proposed to use the equipment after such sale or other disposal.

4. Every person who is the owner of any generating-plant (whether alternating or direct current) or transformer, and every person who is the owner of any conductor or cable as aforesaid, shall furnish to the Electricity Controller full details thereof, including—

(a) In the case of generators—

(i) Type, whether alternating current or direct current (A.C. or D.C.); maker's name; maker's serial number.

(ii) Rating, in kilowatts or kilovolt amperes (kW. or kVA.).

(iii) Voltage.

(iv) Speed.

(v) Whether direct coupled to a prime mover, and type of same.

(vi) If not direct coupled, diameter of shaft for pulley.

(vii) Where located, and name of owner.

(viii) Whether in constant operation, intermittent operation, or not in use.

(ix) In the case of intermittent operation, the reason for such operation.

(b) In the case of distribution transformers—

(i) Type (single or three phase); maker's name; maker's serial number.

(ii) Rating, in kilovolt amperes (kVA.).

(iii) Primary and secondary voltages.

(iv) Where located, and name of owner.

- (c) In the case of hard drawn overhead conductors—
- (i) Whether bare, triple braided, or vulcanized india-rubber (V.I.R.).
 - (ii) Sizes.
 - (iii) Quantities (in miles).
 - (iv) Where located and name of owner.
- (d) In the case of underground electric-supply cables—
- (i) Type, vulcanized india-rubber (V.I.R.) or paper insulated, lead covered, and/or steel armoured.
 - (ii) Voltage.
 - (iii) Number of cores and area of each core.
 - (iv) Quantities (in yards).
 - (v) Where located and name of owner.

5. The said details shall be furnished not later than the 31st day of March, 1942. Any change in the use of generators after the said details have been furnished shall be notified not later than fourteen days after such change.

6. For the purposes of this Order details may be furnished or notification of change of use be given by registered letter addressed to the "Electricity Controller, Public Works Department, Wellington" (E.C. 7/H.O.).

7. This Order shall come into effect on and from the date of notification hereof in the *Gazette*.
