THE ELECTORAL EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 5th day of December, 1941.

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Electoral Emergency Regulations 1941.
2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in section 112 of the Electoral Act, 1927,* any candidate at an election under that Act may withdraw in the manner provided by that section at any time after the time limited for making nominations but not later than two clear days before the day appointed for taking the poll.
3. If a candidate withdraws after the ballot-papers have been printed, the Returning Officer shall, before the poll, erase his name from every ballot-paper.
