ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 29th day of November, 1944

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Evidence Emergency Regulations 1941, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Evidence Emergency Regulations 1941* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding to the definition of the term "oath" the words "and also includes, as well as evidentiary oaths, any promissory oath, including, in particular, any oath of allegiance (whether required for the purposes of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens (in New Zealand) Act, 1928[†], or of any other enactment or for any other purpose)".

3. Every oath sworn before the commencement of these regulations shall be deemed to be and to have always been as valid and effectual as if these regulations had been in force when it was sworn.
