



**THE EXCLUSIVE ECONOMIC ZONE (LICENCE FEES AND
ROYALTIES) REGULATIONS 1987, AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 30th day of November 1987

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 18 and 22 of the Territorial Sea and Exclusive Economic Zone Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees and Royalties) Regulations 1987, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees and Royalties) Regulations 1987* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Licence fees and royalties—(1) The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting in Part I, after the item relating to Silver Warehouse, the following items:

“Squid (<i>Nototodarus sp;</i> <i>Sepioteuthis bilineata</i>)	Southern Islands	..	171
Squid (<i>Nototodarus sp;</i> <i>Sepioteuthis bilineata</i>)	Any other part of New Zealand fisheries waters not being Southern Islands, or the territorial sea or internal waters	..	285”.

(2) The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby further amended by inserting in Part I, after the words “Any other species or class of fish”, the words “(except albacore or tuna to which Part II of this Schedule applies)”.

(3) The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby further amended by omitting Part II, and substituting the Part II set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

SCHEDULE

NEW PART II OF SCHEDULE SUBSTITUTED

Part II

Licence to take by longlining albacore (<i>Thunnus alalunga</i>) or yellowfin tuna (<i>Thunnus albacares</i>)	\$6,000 per vessel
Licence to take by longlining southern bluefin tuna (<i>Thunnus maccoyi</i>) \$127,000 per vessel
Licence as a fish carrier	.. \$5 per tonne of fish-carrying capacity of the fish carrier for each voyage to the exclusive economic zone
Licence as a support craft	.. \$2.50 per gross registered ton of the craft for each voyage to the exclusive economic zone

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, amend the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees and Royalties) Regulations 1987 by adding the following licence fees and royalties:

- (a) For squid taken in the Southern Islands Area—\$171 per tonne;
- (b) For squid taken in any other New Zealand fisheries waters not being Southern Islands, territorial sea or internal waters—\$285 per tonne;
- (c) For a licence to take albacore or yellowfin tuna by longlining—\$6,000 per vessel;
- (d) For a licence to take southern bluefin tuna by longlining—\$127,000 per vessel.
