HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 18 and 22 of the Territorial Sea and Exclusive Economic Zone Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title, commencement, and application—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees and Royalties) Regulations 1988, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees and Royalties) Regulations 1988* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of November 1990, and shall apply in respect of every licence granted or renewed on or after that date.
- 2. Licence fees and royalties—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Schedule (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees and Royalties) Regulations 1988,

Amendment No. 1), and substituting the Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

3. Revocation—The Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees and Royalties) Regulations 1988, Amendment No. 1 are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 November 1990, amend the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees and Royalties) Regulations 1988 by—

(a) Increasing the licence fees and royalties payable in respect of grey mullet, gurnard, and the taking by longlining of albacore and yellowfin tuna:

(b) Reducing the licence fees and royalties payable in respect of red cod, squid, barracouta taken in the Southland area, ling taken in the Sub-Antarctic area, oreo dories taken in the Auckland, Central, Challenger, and Southland areas, and the taking of southern bluefin tuna by longlining:

(c) Introducing a fee of \$14,000 for licences to take skipjack tuna by longlining and pole:

(d) Introducing a fee of \$50 per tonne payable in respect of Southern Blue Whiting:

(e) Increasing the amount payable per tonne of fish-carrying capacity for licences as fish carriers and support craft in the exclusive economic zone.
