ROYALTIES) REGULATIONS 1988, AMENDMENT NO. 5**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 18 and 22 of the Territorial Sea and Exclusive Economic Zone Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title, commencement, and application—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees and Royalties) Regulations 1988, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees and Royalties) Regulations 1988* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, and shall apply in respect of every licence granted or renewed on or after that day.

2. Licence fees and royalties—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking Part II of the Schedule (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees and Royalties) Regulations 1988, Amendment No. 2, and amended by regulation 2 of the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees and Royalties) Regulations 1988, Amendment No. 4), and substituting the Part II set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

3. Revocation—The Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees and Royalties) Regulations 1988, Amendment No. 4 are hereby consequentially revoked.

SCHEDULE

NEW PART II SUBSTITUTED IN SCHEDULE TO PRINCIPAL REGULATIONS

Licence to take by longlining albacore (<i>Thunnus alalunga</i>) or yellowfin tuna (<i>Thunnus albacares</i>) ...	\$14,100 per vessel
Licence to take by longlining southern bluefin tuna (<i>Thunnus maccoyi</i>) ...	\$114,000 per vessel
Licence to take skipjack tuna <i>Katsuwonus pelamis</i> by longlining and pole ...	\$17,000 per vessel
Licence as a fish carrier ...	\$3,000, plus \$8.50 per tonne of fish- carrying capacity of the fish carrier for each voyage to the exclusive economic zone
Licence as a support craft	\$3,000, plus \$4.20 per gross registered ton of the craft for each voyage to the exclusive economic zone.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, increase by \$1,470 per vessel the fees and royalties in respect of—

- (a) Longlining for albacore, yellowfin tuna, and southern bluefin tuna; and
- (b) Licences as fish carriers and support craft.

The increases are associated with the increased costs for vessel monitoring systems regulated by the Fisheries (Satellite Vessel Monitoring) Regulations 1993.

These regulations are administered in the Ministry of Fisheries.
