THE EXCLUSIVE ECONOMIC ZONE (LICENCE FEES FOR FOREIGN FISHING CRAFT) REGULATIONS 1978, AMENDMENT NO. 4

THE RIGHT HON. B. E. TALBOYS PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 22 of the Territorial Sea and Exclusive Economic Zone Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title, commencement, and application—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees for Foreign Fishing Craft) Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees for Foreign Fishing Craft) Regulations 1978* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, and shall apply in respect of every licence granted under section 15 of the Act to have effect on or after the 1st day of April 1980.

2. Interpretation—Regulation 2 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the definition of the term "fishcarrying capacity", the following definition:

"'Fisheries Management Area E' means all that part of the exclusive economic zone lying south of a line commencing in the west at a point on the outer limit of the exclusive

economic zone at the 48° 30' S parallel of latitude; and then proceeding due east to a point 48° 30' S and 171° E; and then proceeding due north to a point 47° S and 171° E; and then proceeding due east to a point 47° S and 176° E; and then proceeding due north to a point 45° 30' S and 176° E; and then proceeding due east to a point 45° 30' S and 176° E; and then proceeding due east to a point on the eastern outer limit of the exclusive economic zone at the 45° 30' S parallel of latitude:".

3. Schedule—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Schedule, and substituting the Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

4. Revocation—The Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees for Foreign Fishing Craft) Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 3 are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

376

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to inducate their general effect.

These regulations provide for an increase in the fees payable by foreign fishing craft for licences to fish by trawling in the exclusive economic zone. The increase is from 17 a tonne to 20 a tonne of fish that the craft is permitted to take, except in Fisheries Management Area E (a defined area lying mainly to the south of the South Island) where the fee remains at 17 a tonne.
