ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 18th day of October 1982

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 22 of the Territorial Sea and Exclusive Economic Zone Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title, commencement, and application—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees for Foreign Fishing Craft) Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 9, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees for Foreign Fishing Craft) Regulations 1978* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, and shall apply in respect of every licence granted under section 15 of the Act to have effect on or after the 1st day of September 1982.

- 2. Increase in foreign licence fees—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Schedule (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees for Foreign Fishing Craft) Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 6 and amended by regulation 2 of the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees for Foreign Fishing Craft) Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 7 and regulation 2 of the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees for Foreign Fishing Craft) Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 8), and substituting the Schedule set out in the First Schedule to these regulations.
- **3. Revocations**—The regulations set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations are hereby consequentially revoked.

NEW SCHEDULE TO PRINCIPAL REGULATIONS

"SCHEDULE

LICENCE FEES

- 1. Licence to fish for squid by jigging
- 2. Licence to fish for squid by trawling
- 3. Licence to fish by trawling in Fisheries Management Area E
- 4. Licence to fish by trawling in areas other than Fisheries
 Management Area E
- 5. Licence to fish by bottomlining
- 6. Licence to fish for albacore and yellowfin tuna by long-lining
- 7. Licence to fish for southern bluefin tuna by long-lining
- 8. Licence to fish for skipjack tuna by purse-seining
- 9. Licence as a fish carrier
- 10. Licence as a support craft

- \$15,000 a year to be paid before commencing fishing, plus \$100 per tonne of fish taken by the craft in excess of 150 tonnes.
- S83 per tonne of fish that the craft is permitted by the conditions of its licence to take.
- \$18 per tonne of fish that the craft is permitted by the conditions of its licence to take.
- S28 per tonne of fish that the craft is permitted by the conditions of its licence to take.
- S30 per tonne of fish that the craft is permitted by the conditions of its licence to take.
- \$3,000 per year.
- \$36,000 per year.
- S65 per tonne of fish taken by the craft.
- S2 per tonne of the fish-carrying capacity of the craft for each voyage to the exclusive economic zone.
- S1 per gross registered ton of the craft for each voyage to the exclusive economic zone."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide for an increase in the fees payable by foreign fishing craft for licences to fish in the exclusive economic zone for-

- (a) Jig caught squid, from \$14,250 to \$15,000 a year per vessel, plus an increase from \$95 to \$100 per tonne for the catch taken by each craft in excess of 150 tonnes:
 (b) Trawl caught squid, from \$70 to \$83 per tonne of fish allocated:
 (c) Long-line caught albacore and yellowfin tuna, from \$1,500 to \$3,000 per year:

- (d) Long-line caught southern bluefin tuna, from \$27,000 to \$36,000 per year.
