**THE EMERGENCY FORCES REHABILITATION REGULATIONS
1953, AMENDMENT NO. 1**

PURSUANT to the Emergency Forces Rehabilitation Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Emergency Forces Rehabilitation Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Emergency Forces Rehabilitation Regulations 1953* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 10, the following regulation:

“10A. For the purposes of the Electricians Act 1952, the term ‘apprentice’ shall be deemed to include and to have always included a discharged serviceman engaged in the electrical wiring trade, or any branch thereof approved by the Electricians Registration Board, under any scheme established by the Rehabilitation Board for the training of discharged servicemen for that trade.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations extend the definition of the term "apprentice" in the Electricians Act 1952 so as to include rehabilitation trainees in the electrical wiring trade. This will ensure that all such trainees are regarded as apprentices for the purpose of gaining qualifying experience for registration as electricians or as electrical servicemen, and generally for the purposes of the Electricians Act.

The regulations relate to trainees who are discharged servicemen under the Emergency Forces Rehabilitation Regulations 1953.
