**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Education (Post-primary Instruction) Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education (Post-primary Instruction) Regulations 1954\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (1), and substituting the following subclause:

“(1) The School Certificate shall be awarded to every pupil who has obtained a pass in the School Certificate Examination as provided in regulation 6 of these regulations, and who has in addition thereto completed to the satisfaction of the Director either—

“(a) A course of at least three years’ work in accordance with the provisions of regulations 3 and 4 of these regulations; or

“(b) A course of instruction, deemed by the Director to be equivalent thereto, which has been completed in whole or in part outside New Zealand.”

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations clarify the right of overseas students, particularly those from the Pacific Islands, to be awarded the School Certificate.
