THE EDUCATION (SECONDARY INSTRUCTION) REGULATIONS 1975, AMENDMENT NO. 1

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Education (Secondary Instruction) Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education (Secondary Instruction) Regulations 1975* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Interpretation—Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by repealing the definition of the expressions "Group B subject" and "Group C subject".

3. Conditions for school candidates—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 8, and substituting the following regulation:

"8. (1) Entries in any year from school candidates may be accepted in any number of subjects not exceeding 6.

"(2) Every such candidate shall, as a condition of his entry for the examination, undertake in the same year as the examination a course of study in English, as that subject is prescribed for the School Certificate Examination, or an alternative course of at least 4 hours a week in English.

"(3) Every candidate who undertakes an alternative course in accordance with subclause (2) of this regulation shall be required, as a further condition of his entry for the examination, to obtain a certificate stating

that, in respect of the alternative course so taken, he has shown a satisfactory attitude to work, has fulfilled reasonable homework requirements, has completed any practical course that is required as part of the course of study for the subject, and has not been absent without reasonable excuse for a period or periods prejudicial to the satisfactory completion of that course:

"Provided that any certificate so given shall be in respect of the period up to the date of commencement of the School Certificate Examination, but shall be provisional and subject to revocation by the Principal at any time before that date if he considers the circumstances so warrant."

4. Revocation—The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking regulation 9.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations remove the grouping of subjects as a condition of entry by Form V pupils for the School Certificate Examination.
