THE EXPORT LICENCES EXEMPTION NOTICE 1982

PURSUANT to regulation 11 of the Export Licences Regulations 1966, the Minister of Customs hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Export Licences Exemption Notice 1982.

(2) This notice shall come into force on the 1st day of May 1982.

2. Goods exempt from the requirements of the Export Licences Regulations 1966—It is hereby directed that the Export Licences Regulations 1966 shall not apply to goods of the kinds specified in the Schedule hereto.

3. Revocations—The following notices are hereby revoked:

- (a) The Export Licences Exemption Notice 1966*;
- (b) The Export Licences Exemption Notice 1966, Amendment No. 1†;
- (c) The Export Licences Exemption Notice 1966, Amendment No. 2‡.

SCHEDULE

GOODS EXEMPTED FROM APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS

1. Bona fide gifts to persons resident outside New Zealand.
2. Trade samples supplied without charge to persons resident outside New Zealand.
3. Goods being bona fide passengers' baggage and effects, except goods sold ex-warehouse or under drawback of duty or sales tax.
4. Goods being exported temporarily for repair and return to New Zealand.
5. Other goods not referred to in any of clauses 1 to 4 of this Schedule, having a free on board value not exceeding \$100, and not being goods sold ex-warehouse or under drawback of duty or sales tax.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice consolidates the previous notices exempting specific types of goods from the requirements of the Export Licences Regulations 1966 and increases the f.o.b. value of goods exempted from application of the regulations from \$50 to \$100.
