**THE EMPLOYERS' LIABILITY INSURANCE REGULATIONS 1951
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 7th day of

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Workers' Compensation Amendment Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 14 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (3), and substituting the following subclause :—

“(3) Whether by way of commission, expenses, allowances, or any other form of payment whatsoever, the total remuneration that may be paid by an insurer to an agent in respect of employers' liability insurance shall not in the aggregate exceed a sum equivalent to 5 per cent of the premiums payable to the insurer in respect of employers' liability insurance through that agent or in respect of employers' liability insurance secured by him :

“Provided that an insurer having neither a head office nor a branch office in any of the cities of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin may in that city have a controlling agent, and to that agent, with the approval of the Board first obtained, he may pay a total remuneration by way of commission, expenses, allowances, or any other form of payment not exceeding in the aggregate a sum equivalent to 15 per cent of the premiums payable to the insurer in respect of employers' liability insurance through that agent or in respect of employers' liability insurance secured by him :

“Provided also that an insurer having a controlling agent shall forthwith inform the Board of any change in the status of that agent.”

3. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the items set out in the First Schedule hereto.

4. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby further amended by adding the items set out in the Second Schedule hereto.
