**THE EMPLOYERS' LIABILITY INSURANCE REGULATIONS
1954, AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 8th day of February 1955

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. K. J. HOLYOAKE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Workers' Compensation Amendment Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1954* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1955.

2. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the proviso to subclause (1), and also by inserting, after subclause (1), the following subclause:

“(1A) Every premium assessed on or after the 1st day of April 1955 (whether it is assessed at the maximum rate or at any lower rate) shall be subject to a rebate of $12\frac{1}{2}$ per cent, or to such greater rebate as the insurer thinks fit. Where a premium is adjusted under section 14 of the Act this subclause shall apply only to any further premium assessed under subsection (4) of that section.”

3. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the items set out in the First Schedule hereto.

4. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the items set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

1. These regulations amend the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1954 by providing that all premiums assessed on or after 1 April 1955 shall be subject to a rebate of not less than 12½ per cent (including further premiums assessed after an adjustment, and also including premiums assessed at less than the maximum rate). This is in substitution for the existing rebate of 7½ per cent on premiums assessed at the maximum rate.

2. The regulations also amend some of the rates of premium prescribed by the principal regulations. The rates set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations are substituted for those set out in the First Schedule.
