**THE EMPLOYERS' LIABILITY INSURANCE REGULATIONS  
1962, AMENDMENT NO. 4**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 15th day of March 1965

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Workers' Compensation Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1962, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1962\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1965.

2. (1) Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (4) and substituting the following subclause:

“(4) Clerical workers, where occupied solely in office work, shall be rated at the rate shown in the said Schedule under the heading ‘Offices, banks, etc.’ for clerical work, irrespective of the employer’s classification. A working director, a manager, or any other employee who undertakes no work of any kind in an employer’s business other than work of managerial or supervisory nature shall be classed as a clerical worker, but any working director, manager, or other employee employed in a managerial or supervisory capacity who actually undertakes work normally performed by workers engaged in the trade, business, or profession of the employer shall have his earnings classified in the following manner that is to say:

The first £1,250 earned in any one period of twelve months shall be classified in the same classification in which the employer's trade, business, or profession is classified, and any amount earned in excess of £1,250 in any one period of twelve months shall be classified in the same classification as for clerical workers."

(2) Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by revoking paragraph (a) of subclause (8) and substituting the following subclause:

"(a) If the contract is for labour only, unless otherwise decided by the insurer, on 100 per cent of the contract price:"

3. The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking regulation 7, and substituting the following regulation:

"CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE

"7. On payment of the premium an assessment of premium shall be issued. The assessment of premium shall constitute for the purposes of section 93 (3) of the Act, and for all other purposes, a certificate of insurance for the period shown on the assessment."

4. The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended—

(a) By omitting from subparagraph (1) of paragraph (b) of clause 3 of form 1 the words "£515 per annum", and substituting the words "£563 per annum":

(b) By omitting from subparagraph (2) of the same paragraph the words "£800 per annum", and substituting the words "£1,250 per annum".

5. (1) The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking the Second Schedule (as substituted by regulation 2 of The Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1962, Amendment No. 2, and amended by regulation 2 of The Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1962, Amendment No. 3), and substituting the Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) The Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1962, Amendment No. 2, and the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1962, Amendment No. 3, are hereby revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations provide for amendments in the classification of working directors, managers, and supervisory personnel, and provision is also made for variation of rates in the case of labour-only contracts.

An amendment is also made to the form of the employer's statement of wages with respect to share farmers.

A new scale of employers' liability insurance premiums is substituted for the old scale, and will come into force on 1 April 1965.

These regulations are administered in the Department of Labour.
