ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 20th day of March 1972

Pursuant to the Workers' Compensation Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1968, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1968* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April

1972.

2. Rates of premium—Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding to subclause (1) the following proviso:

"Provided that in respect of any period commencing on or after the 1st day of April 1972 the rates set out in the Second Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be increased by 5 percent."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase by 5 percent, as from 1 April 1972, the rates of all premiums except those for domestic workers employed by private householders.
