**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 30th day of October 1972

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Export Licences Regulations 1966, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Export Licences Regulations 1966\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of November 1972.

**2. Applications for licences**—(1) Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (a) of subclause (1), and substituting the following paragraph:

“(a) For a particular licence or a purchaser’s licence, to the Collector of Customs with whom the entry for export is to be lodged:”

(2) The said regulation 5 is hereby further amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause:

“(2) Every application for a particular licence or a purchaser’s licence shall be made on the entry.”

**3. Forms of application and licences**—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 6, and substituting the following regulation:

“6. Every application, and any licence granted in respect thereof, shall be—

“(a) In the case of a particular licence and a purchaser’s licence, included in form 22, 27, or 35, as the case may require, being forms 22, 27, and 35 within the meaning of the Customs Regulations 1968:

“(b) In the case of a general licence, in form 2 in the Schedule hereto.”

(2) The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking forms 1 and 3.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

The effect of these regulations is to eliminate the separate form of application and licence in respect of a particular licence or a purchaser's licence for the export of goods. The form required under the Customs Regulations 1968 for the appropriate Customs entry is now to be used also for this purpose.
