## THE EDUCATION (GRADING OF PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHERS) REGULATIONS 1948, AMENDMENT NO. 2

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Education (Grading of Public School Teachers) Regulations 1948, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education (Grading of Public School Teachers) Regulations 1948\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. (1) Regulation 15 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 5 of the Education (Grading of Public School Teachers) Regulations 1948, Amendment No. 1, is hereby amended by omitting the words "head teachers of public schools of Grade VI or higher and infant mistresses holding positions of the highest grade who make application", and substituting the words "any teacher who makes application".
- (2) Regulation 5 of the Education (Grading or Public School Teachers) Regulations 1948, Amendment No. 1, is hereby revoked.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations amend regulation 15 of the principal regulations so as to provide that any teacher who makes application not to be graded shall not be awarded grading marks.
