PURSUANT to the Electric Power Boards Act 1925, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Electric Power Boards Remuneration Regulations 1978, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Electric Power Boards Remuneration Regulations 1978* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- 2. Schedule—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Schedule thereto, and substituting the Schedule set out in the Schedule to this Act.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide for remuneration to members and Chairmen of committees of electric power boards at new rates similar to those currently paid to members of other local authorities.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 19 March 1981. These regulations are administered in the Ministry of Energy.
