**THE EXPORT PROHIBITION EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1939,
AMENDMENT NO. 1.**

THE HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Export Prohibition Emergency Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 1.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Export Prohibition Emergency Regulations 1939* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.

4. The principal regulations are amended by inserting next after Regulation 6 the following additional regulations:—

“ 6A. The Minister may at any time prior to shipment by notice in writing given to the person to whom the permission was granted revoke any permission for the export of any goods granted by him or by the Comptroller or a Collector and may direct the Comptroller of Customs or a Collector of Customs at any such time as aforesaid and in like manner to revoke any such permission granted by the Comptroller or such Collector respectively.

“ 6B. Regulation 6A hereof shall apply to all permissions, whether granted before or after the enactment of Regulation 6A.”
