THE ENEMY PROPERTY EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1939, AMENDMENT No. 3.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 6th day of September, 1940.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 3.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and deemed part of the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 3. Regulation 1 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the definition of the term "enemy country" in clause (2), and substituting the following definition:—
 - "'Enemy country' or 'enemy territory' includes-
 - "(a) The territories of any State with which His Majesty is for the time being at war;
 - "(b) Any territory for the time being in the occupation of or under the control of any such State; or
 - "(c) Any territory which the Governor-General may by Proclamation declare to be an enemy country for the purposes of these regulations."
