**THE ENEMY PROPERTY EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1939,
AMENDMENT No. 3.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 6th day of
September, 1940.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 3.
2. These regulations shall be read together with and deemed part of the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
3. Regulation 1 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the definition of the term "enemy country" in clause (2), and substituting the following definition :—

“ ‘Enemy country’ or ‘enemy territory’ includes—

- “ (a) The territories of any State with which His Majesty is for the time being at war ;
- “ (b) Any territory for the time being in the occupation of or under the control of any such State ; or
- “ (c) Any territory which the Governor-General may by Proclamation declare to be an enemy country for the purposes of these regulations.”
