**THE ENEMY PROPERTY EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1939,  
AMENDMENT NO. 4.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 1st day of  
October, 1941.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 4.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939\* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following the notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.

4. Clause (3) of Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is amended by adding, after the words "if he thinks it expedient in the public interest", the words "and unless the Attorney-General by notice in writing otherwise directs".

5. Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is further amended by adding thereto the following additional clause:—

"(9) When any moneys have been paid or documents delivered to the Custodian pursuant to this regulation and it appears to the Attorney-General that such payment or delivery has been made by reason of misapprehension as to facts or law on the part of any person, then the Attorney-General may give, subject to such terms and conditions (if any) as he thinks fit, an order or direction that any moneys so paid or documents so delivered shall be repaid or

redelivered to the person who paid or delivered the same respectively or to the personal representative, successor, or assign of that person, and the Custodian shall make such repayment or redelivery accordingly, and thereupon all rights, obligations, and liabilities affected by the payment to the Custodian of the moneys so repaid or by the delivery to the Custodian of the documents so redelivered, including obligations and liabilities arising under these regulations, shall be determined as if no such payment or delivery had in the first instance been made.”
