THE ENEMY PROPERTY EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1939, AMENDMENT NO. 5

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking Regulation 11, and substituting the following regulation :—

"REGULATION 11.—DISTRIBUTION OF ESTATES OF DECEASED PERSONS

"No executor, administrator, or trustee of the estate of any deceased person shall, without the written consent of the Attorney-General, distribute or pay any part of the assets or proceeds of that estate to any beneficiary or creditor who is an enemy, or to any person on his behalf."

(2) Regulations 10 and 11 of the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 1, are hereby consequentially revoked.
