Pursuant to the Emergency Regulations Continuance Act, 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 7, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Enemy Property Emergency Regulations 1939\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary expressed or implied in regulation 12 of the principal regulations or in section 41 of the Finance Act, 1950, or in any Proclamation made under that section, the Public Trustee shall not, except with the consent of the Attorney-General, pay or transfer to any person any property received by the Public Trustee as Custodian of Enemy Property or any income of any such property.
