THE ELECTORAL REGULATIONS 1957, AMENDMENT NO. 1

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Electoral Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Electoral Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Electoral Regulations 1957* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1963.

2. The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking forms 1, 2, and 3, and substituting the new forms 1, 2, and 3 set out in the Schedule hereto.

APPLICATION FOR ENROLMENT ON PARLIAMENTARY ELECTORAL ROLL

QUALIFICATIONS FOR ENROLMENT

You are qualified to be registered as an elector if you:

1. Have attained the age of 21 years.
2. Are a British subject ordinarily resident in New Zealand*.
3. Have at some period resided continuously in New Zealand for one year or longer.
4. Have resided in the electoral district for a period of three months or longer.

NOTE—You are entitled to register only for the electoral district in which you have most recently resided for a continuous period of three months or longer.

INFORMATION FOR ELECTORS

1. A Maori (other than a half-caste) must apply for registration on the Maori Roll. A half-caste may choose whether he will apply in respect of a Maori or a European electoral district.
2. A person who fails to apply for enrolment within one month of becoming qualified in respect of any electoral district is liable to prosecution. All changes of address must also be notified.
3. This form, when completed, should be forwarded to the Registrar of Electors for the district.

THIS FORM MUST NOT BE USED FOR MAORI ROLL APPLICATIONS

*NOTE—To be ordinarily resident in New Zealand, a person must be, or have been, actually resident in New Zealand with the intention of residing therein indefinitely. If he is absent from New Zealand he must have had, ever since he left New Zealand, an intention to return to reside therein indefinitely; and, except in the case of a public servant or the wife or husband of a public servant, must not have been absent from New Zealand for more than three years.

CAUTION—Any person making a false statement is liable to a fine of £50 or to three months' imprisonment, and any person signing the name of any other person, whether requested to do so or not, is liable to a fine of £50.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR ENROLMENT

You are qualified to be registered as an elector if you:

1. Have attained the age of 21 years.
2. Are a British subject ordinarily resident in New Zealand*.
3. Have at some period resided continuously in New Zealand for one year or longer.
4. Because of your occupation or employment, or that of your spouse, have not, since you arrived in New Zealand, resided continuously for three months in any one electoral district.
5. Reside in the electoral district, or have resided in the district and have not subsequently resided in any other electoral district.

INFORMATION FOR ELECTORS

1. This form, when completed, should be forwarded to the Registrar of Electors for the district.
2. A person who fails to apply for enrolment within one month of becoming qualified in respect of any electoral district is liable to prosecution. All changes of address must also be notified.

*NOTE—To be ordinarily resident in New Zealand, a person must be, or have been, actually resident in New Zealand with the intention of residing therein indefinitely. If he is absent from New Zealand he must have had, ever since he left New Zealand, an intention to return to reside therein indefinitely; and, except in the case of a public servant or the wife or husband of a public servant, must not have been absent from New Zealand for more than three years.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR ENROLMENT

You are qualified to be registered as an elector if you:

1. Have attained the age of 21 years.
2. Possess half or more Maori blood.
3. Are a British subject ordinarily resident in New Zealand.
4. Have at some period resided continuously in New Zealand for one year or longer.
5. Have resided in the electoral district for a period of three months or longer.

NOTE—You are entitled to register only for the electoral
district in which you have most recently resided for a con-
tinuous period of three months or longer.

INFORMATION FOR ELECTORS

1. Applications for registration on the Maori Roll must be sent to the Chief Electoral Officer, Wellington.
2. A half-caste Maori may choose whether he will apply for Maori or European enrolment.
3. Any elector who fails to apply for enrolment within one month of becoming qualified in respect of any electoral district is liable to prosecution. All changes of address must also be notified.

CAUTION—Any person making a false statement is liable to a fine of £50 or to three months' imprisonment, and any person signing the name of any other person, whether requested to do so or not, is liable to a fine of £50.
