ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 27th day of November 1978

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 62 of the Explosives Act 1957, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Explosives Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Explosives Regulations 1959* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Signal and distress flares and rockets—Regulation 71 (2) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the words “, or in any emergency situation”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations allow distress and signal flares and rockets and similar fireworks, at present restricted for use on vessels or aircraft, to be acquired for use in any emergency situation.
