



THE ELECTORAL REGULATIONS 1981, AMENDMENT NO. 10

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 4th day of March 1991

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. J. B. BOLGER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Electoral Act 1956, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Electoral Regulations 1981, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Electoral Regulations 1981* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 5th day of April 1991.

2. Form 1—The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended—

(a) By omitting from the back of page 1 of form 1 (as substituted by regulation 24 (1) of the Electoral Regulations 1981, Amendment No. 8) the expression “7 April 1986”, and substituting the expression “[*Insert date*]”:

- (b) By omitting from the back of page 1 of form 1 (as so substituted) the expression “6 April 1986”, and substituting the expression “[*Insert date*]”:
- (c) By omitting from the back of page 1 of form 1 (as so substituted) the expression “1991”, and substituting the expression “[*Insert year*]”.

3. Form 3A—The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking form 3A (as inserted by regulation 2 (2) of the Electoral Regulations 1981, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the form 3A set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

4. Revocations—(1) The Electoral Regulations 1981, Amendment No. 1 are hereby consequentially revoked.

(2) The Electoral Regulations 1981, Amendment No. 8 are hereby consequentially amended by revoking subclauses (4) to (6) of regulation 24.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 5 April 1991, amend the Electoral Regulations 1981.

Regulation 2 effects minor amendments to form 1 (Application for Registration as a Parliamentary Elector).

Regulation 3 revokes the existing form 3A (Notice Concerning Exercise of Maori Option), and substitutes a new form 3A.

Regulation 4 effects consequential revocations.

Issued under the authority of the Acts and Regulations Publication Act 1989.

Date of notification in *Gazette*: 7 March 1991.

These regulations are administered in the Department of Justice.
