



THE EGG RATIONING ORDER 1943

PURSUANT to Regulation 8 of the Rationing Emergency Regulations 1942* (hereinafter referred to as the regulations), the Minister of Supply and Munitions hereby makes the following Order :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Egg Rationing Order 1943.
2. This Order shall come into force on the 14th day of June, 1943.
3. The following goods shall be rationed goods for the purposes of the regulations—namely, eggs, meaning the eggs of domestic fowls or ducks, and including any such eggs that have been chilled or preserved.
4. The retailers of the rationed goods hereinbefore referred to shall be licensed under the regulations.
5. The consumers of the rationed goods hereinbefore referred to shall be registered under the regulations.
6. Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall apply with respect to the supply of any eggs under the authority of a permit granted by the Rationing Controller under the regulations, or shall require the licensing of the retailers or the registration of the consumers of any eggs so supplied.
