**THE ECONOMIC STABILISATION (SLAUGHTERING AND

PURSUANT to the Economic Stabilisation Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Economic Stabilisation (Slaughtering and Processing Charges) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Economic Stabilisation (Slaughtering and Processing Charges) Regulations 1977* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 29th day of March 1978.

2. Expiry—Regulation 2 (2) of the principal regulations is hereby revoked.

3. Admissible costs limited—Regulation 4 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the words “increases in remuneration”, the words “, in respect of the period commencing with the 22nd day of November 1977 and ending with the 31st day of July 1978,”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The principal regulations limit the increases in remuneration that may be claimed as admissible costs, in calculating, for the purposes of the Stabilisation of Prices Regulations 1974, increases in charges for the slaughtering of stock or for the processing of stock or for both in any export slaughterhouse or abattoir. The amendment made by these regulations limits the effect of the principal regulations so that it is only increases above $7\frac{1}{2}$ percent, in respect of the period commencing with the 22nd day of November 1977 and ending with the 31st day of July 1978, which may not be claimed as admissible costs.
