**THE ECONOMIC STABILISATION (IMPORT DEPOSIT)  
NOTICE 1976**

---

PURSUANT to the Economic Stabilisation (Import Deposit) Regulations 1976\*, the Minister of Trade and Industry hereby gives the following notice.

---

**NOTICE**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This notice may be cited as the Economic Stabilisation (Import Deposit) Notice 1976.

(2) This notice shall come into force on the 2nd day of February 1976.

**2. Interpretation**—In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(a) The terms “Collector”, “Customs Tariff”, and “imported” have the same meaning as in the Customs Act 1966:

(b) The term “the Regulations” means the Economic Stabilisation (Import Deposit) Regulations 1976\*.

**3. Imported goods subject to the regulations**—Pursuant to regulation 3 of the regulations, the regulations shall apply to the goods included in the Customs Tariff headings and items specified in the First Schedule hereto, being goods imported on or after the 2nd day of February 1976:

Provided that those goods shall not include any goods specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

**4. Amount of deposit**—Pursuant to regulation 4 (2) of the regulations the amount of the deposit in respect of the goods specified in clause 3 of this notice shall be one third of the current domestic value of those goods as determined for the purposes of the Customs Act 1966.

**5. Period of deposit**—Pursuant to regulation 5 of the regulations the period for which the deposit in respect of the goods specified in clause 3 of the notice shall be retained shall be the period of 6 months commencing on the date of payment.

SECOND SCHEDULE

Clause 3

GOODS EXCLUDED FROM APPLICATION OF THE REGULATIONS

1. Goods which at the time of importation are the property of the Crown in respect of the Government of New Zealand.
2. Goods being the property of the Governor-General at the time of importation and not imported or purchased by him for the purposes of sale.
3. Goods which do not exceed in value in respect of any one importation the sum of \$100 (C.I.F. New Zealand currency) provided that postal packets and packages imported by air, posted, or freighted, by any one exporter, whether addressed to the same or different persons, may, if the Collector so directs, be treated as a single package consigned to a single person for the purposes of this notice.
4. Goods imported from and being the produce or manufacture of the Cook Islands, Niue, or Western Samoa.
5. Passengers' baggage and effects in respect of which the Collector is satisfied that they are not intended for any other person or persons or for gift, sale, or exchange.
6. Goods admitted free of duty under the Diplomatic Privileges and Immunities Act 1968, for use of Diplomatic and Consular Officers, Trade Commissioners or other accredited representatives of any Commonwealth or foreign Government, the United Nations, or of any specialised agency of the United Nations.
7. Goods imported by organisations or personnel of organisations which have been approved under the Customs Duties Suspension (Inter-Governmental Agreements) Order 1963.
8. Heirlooms.
9. Ships' or aircraft stores imported on declaration that they are to be re-exported and not entered for home consumption.
