1942, AMENDMENT NO. 2**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 30th day of

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 43A of the principal regulations, as set out in Regulation 8 of the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, Amendment No. 1†, is hereby amended by revoking subclause (7), and substituting the following subclause :—

“(7) The Court shall have regard to the general purpose of these regulations in approving any industrial agreement or voluntary agreement under this regulation and in making any award to which subclause (2) of this regulation relates where the award is made under section 3 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Act (No. 2), 1939, in respect of a settlement arrived at on or after the 15th day of December, 1942, and in making any apprenticeship order to which subclause (2) of this regulation relates.”
