Pursuant to the Economic Stabilisation Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Economic Stabilisation (Charges for Aerial Topdressing) Regulations 1971.
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Maximum price for aerial topdressing-Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Air Services Licensing Act 1951, the maximum prices or charges which may be charged or made by any licensee within the meaning of that Act for any work or service relating to the aerial application of fertiliser or lime (whether combined with any other substance or not) shall be the prices or charges which the licensee was normally charging or making as at the 10th day of June 1971.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide that the maximum prices or charges which may be charged or made by aerial topdressers shall be the prices or charges normally charged or made as at 10 June 1971.
