PURSUANT to the Economic Stabilisation Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Economic Stabilisation Regulations 1973, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Economic Stabilisation Regulations 1973\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Functions and powers of Tribunal**—Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:

“(4) The Tribunal may at any time decide any question as to the construction or application of any decision, determination, or order of the Tribunal, whether made before or after the commencement of this subclause.”
