**THE EDUCATION (SCHOLARSHIPS TO MAORI PUPILS)
EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1944**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 12th day
of April, 1944

Present :

THE HON D. G. SULLIVAN PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Education (Scholarships to Maori Pupils) Emergency Regulations 1944.
2. These regulations apply with respect to scholarships granted to Maori pupils under any of the following regulations, namely :—
 - (a) Regulation 107 or Regulation 110 or Regulation 124 of the regulations relating to Native schools, made by Order in Council dated the 23rd day of June, 1931, and published in the *Gazette** of the 25th day of the same month ; or
 - (b) Regulation 5 of the Native School Regulations, 1931, Amendment No. 3†.
3. (1) Where any scholarship to which these regulations apply has heretofore been or is hereafter held at a school where the annual charge for accommodation exceeds the annual value of the scholarship the Minister of Education may in his discretion authorize the payment to or in respect of the holder of an amount (in addition to the value of the scholarship) not exceeding in any year the difference between the value of the scholarship and the charge made for accommodation.

(2) No payment shall be authorized under the last preceding subclause in respect of any scholarship that has expired before the commencement of these regulations.

(3) Subject to the last preceding subclause, payments may be authorized under this regulation in respect of any period (whether before or after the commencement of these regulations).

(4) All payments under these regulations shall be made out of moneys available for the payment of scholarships to Maori children. Any such payment may, as the Minister determines, be paid to or on behalf of the holder of the scholarship or to the controlling authority of the school at which the scholarship is held.
