



THE ENEMY TRADING (GERMANY) NOTICE (NO. 2) 1947

PURSUANT to clause (2) of Regulation 5 of the Enemy Trading Emergency Regulations 1939, the Minister of Industries and Commerce hereby gives notice as follows:—

1. This notice may be cited as the Enemy Trading (Germany) Notice (No. 2) 1947.

2. (1) Unless the Minister otherwise directs, and subject to the provisions of this notice, any person may trade within Germany with any Government, public, or other authority or with any person or body of persons (whether incorporated or not) carrying on business therein.

(2) For the purposes of this notice "trade" means supplying to or for the use or benefit of, or obtaining from, any Government, public, or other authority in Germany or any person or body of persons (whether incorporated or not) carrying on business therein any goods, wares, or merchandise; and includes—

- (a) Transactions incidental to supplying or obtaining any such goods, wares, or merchandise;
- (b) The paying, transmitting, or receiving of any money, negotiable instrument, or security for money in respect of such trade.

3. This notice shall not extend to or authorize—

- (a) The performance of any contract of insurance or reinsurance entered into before the date of this notice;
- (b) The payment of any bill of exchange payable in New Zealand and drawn before the date of this notice to or for the benefit of any Government, public, or other authority in Germany or any person or body of persons carrying on business therein;
- (c) The encashment of any coupons by or on behalf of any Government, public, or other authority in Germany or any person or body of persons carrying on business therein.

4. For the purposes of this notice the expression "Germany" means Berlin and the French, British, American, and Russian Military Zones of Germany as established by the statement by the Governments of the United Kingdom, the United States of America, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and the Provisional Government of the French Republic on the zones of occupation in Germany on the 5th June, 1945, and also those parts of the former German Reich which are at present administered by the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.
