



**THE FISHERIES (SOUTH-EAST AREA AMATEUR FISHING)
REGULATIONS 1986, AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 13th day of November 1989

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 89 of the Fisheries Act 1983, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (South-East Area Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (South-East Area Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. New regulations inserted—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 6, the following regulations:

“6A. Use of drag nets in Akaroa Harbour and Lyttelton Harbour—
(1) Notwithstanding regulation 13 (a) of the Fisheries (Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986†, a person may use a drag net in the waters specified in

subclause (2) of this regulation, or possess a drag net in or adjacent to those waters, if—

“(a) The net length does not exceed 40 m; and

“(b) The total warp length does not exceed 600 m.

“(2) Subclause (1) of this regulation applies to—

“(a) Those waters lying inside a straight line drawn from the south-eastern extremity of Timutimu Head (otherwise known as Iron Head) (at $43^{\circ}54.0'S$ and $172^{\circ}57'E$) to the southern extremity of Te Ruahine Point (at $43^{\circ}53.3'S$ and $172^{\circ}58.2'E$);

“(b) Those waters lying inside a straight line drawn from Godley Head lighthouse (at $43^{\circ}35.4'S$ and $172^{\circ}48.5'E$) to Adderley Head (at $43^{\circ}35'S$ and $172^{\circ}49.7'E$).

“6B. **Minimum size restriction on quinnat salmon caught in Otago Harbour**—No person shall—

“(a) Take any quinnat salmon that is less than 40 cm in length from those waters of Otago Harbour that are enclosed by a straight line drawn from Heywards Point (at $45^{\circ}45.4'S$ and $170^{\circ}41.4'E$) to Taiaroa Head (at $45^{\circ}46.5'S$ and $170^{\circ}43.6'E$); or

“(b) Possess any quinnat salmon less than 40 cm in length that is taken from those waters.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations—

(a) Allow in Akaroa and Lyttelton Harbours the use of drag nets whose length does not exceed 40 m and whose total warp length does not exceed 600 m; and

(b) Impose a minimum size restriction of 40 cm on quinnat salmon taken from Otago Harbour.
