**THE FOOD AND DRUG (DAIRY PRODUCE) EXEMPTION
ORDER 1976**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 8th day of November 1976

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 3 of the Dairy Industry Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

O R D E R

1. Title—This order may be cited as the Food and Drug (Dairy Produce) Exemption Order 1976.

2. Dairy produce intended for export—It is hereby directed that nothing in the Food and Drug Act 1969 shall apply to dairy produce that is packed exclusively for export and is not sold in New Zealand except in the course or for the purpose of export.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

Some overseas markets accept or even require dairy produce that does not comply with the requirements of the Food and Drug Act 1969. To the extent that the Dairy Board purchases in New Zealand all the dairy produce it exports,

the export from New Zealand by the Board of any such dairy produce necessarily involves the sale of that produce to the Board within New Zealand and therefore a breach of that Act. The order exempts dairy produce from the requirements of that Act if the only time it is sold within New Zealand it is for the purpose of export.
